Dear Ms. Calhoun:

I am responding to your letter of July 19, 2000, to Region I Administrator Hubert J. Miller. In your letter you voiced your support for Congressman Benjamin Gilman's request that the decision to restart the Indian Point Nuclear Generating Unit No. 2 (IP2) be removed from the authority of the Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation and be rendered by the full Commission.

The Consolidated Edison Company of New York, Inc. (ConEd), recently announced that the steam generators at IP2 will be replaced before the unit is restarted. The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff will focus its oversight on ConEd's replacement work, monitor the inspections of the new steam generators, and conduct inspection and assessment activities associated with the NRC's designation of IP2 as an "agency focus" plant.

I have enclosed a copy of Chairman Meserve's response to Congressman Gilman's request. The staff has kept and will continue to keep the Commission informed of its review activities, both as they relate to the restart of IP2 and to the licensee's overall corrective actions to improve plant performance.

I trust that this letter addresses your concerns.
