Ladies and Gentlemen:

By letter dated February 18, 2008 (Reference 1), Duke Energy Progress, Inc. (DEP) submitted an application for a combined construction permit and operating license (COL) for two AP1000 advanced pressurized water reactor units to be located at the existing Shearon Harris Nuclear Power Plant site. By letter dated April 15, 2013 (Reference 2), DEP provided the latest revision, Revision 5, to the Shearon Harris Nuclear Power Plant, Units 2 and 3 (HAR) combined license application (COLA).

In the initial application, DEP relied on Integrated Resource Plans (IRPs) prepared for the North Carolina Utilities Commission and the Public Service Commission of South Carolina to demonstrate the need for HAR Units 2 and 3. These IRPs used a 15-year period for forecasting native load requirements, supply-side and demand-side resources, and options considered for satisfaction of load requirements and other system obligations. DEP has continued to evaluate the Need for Power for HAR in order to provide the information needed to complete the environmental review; however, the commercial operation dates for HAR Units 2 and 3 no longer fall within the 15-year planning window of the IRP. As a result, DEP hereby requests that

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the NRC suspend review of the HAR COLA, including any supporting reviews by external agencies, until further notice.

DEP proposes to work closely with the NRC staff in assessing each of the remaining open items such that suspension of the COLA review can be accomplished in a timely and orderly manner that preserves the work accomplished to date to the greatest extent practical. The HAR COLA will remain docketed and, pursuant to 10 CFR 52.3(b)(6) and 10 CFR 50.71(e), DEP will continue to submit annual FSAR updates to the NRC.
