#### **Chairman Klein's Comments on SECY-07-0052**

I approve the staff recommendations to perform drug testing at a rate of 50% for NRC employees and to perform random testing of badged or unbadged contractors in sensitive positions.

I support Commissioner Lyons' comment regarding updating the tracking system. It was understood from COMSECY-06-0043 that resources for this would be covered in the cost of annual software application maintenance.

I echo Commissioner McGaffigan's concern the fact that drug testing of contractors cannot be based solely on having access to NRC physical facilities according to applicable law.

#### Commissioner McGaffigan's Comments on SECY-07-0052

I support the staff's proposals for both the testing rate for NRC employees (50 percent) and contractor drug testing.

I note that the latter proposal is limited to those contractors in sensitive positions or who admit to recent illegal drug use. The staff informs us "Drug testing of contractors based solely on their having access to NRC physical facilities cannot be justified under applicable law."

I personally would urge Congress to close this loophole. If Congress truly desires "drug free" federal workplaces, Congress needs to ensure that contractor employees, who work side-by-side with federal employees, with access badges to most of the facility where they are employed, are covered by mandatory drug testing programs.

#### Commissioner Merrifield's comments on SECY-07-0052:

I disapprove the staff's recommended Option 2 (testing 50% of NRC employees) in favor of Option 1 (testing 25% of NRC employees). As the staff's paper highlights, over the past two years, there have been less than .05% positive drug tests. At that testing rate, I can not justify increasing the agency's costs for this program by an additional \$394K, even as the program is being expanded to all agency personnel and some contractors. I would begin at the 25% testing rate and adjust periodically as the testing results warrant.

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### Commissioner Jaczko's Comments on SECY-07-0052 NRC Drug-Free Workplace Plan - Recommended Testing Rate

I approve the staff's recommendations for the random drug testing rate for employees as well as the staff's recommendations for contractor drug testing. For employees, I agree with the staff's Option 2 that a 50 percent random testing rate should be maintained. I believe continuing to provide the same level of deterrence to substance abuse is important, even though the number of employees subject to testing will increase to include all employees, as all NRC employees require security clearances.

For contractors, I agree with the staff's Option 2. I understand that there are constitutional issues surrounding expanding drug testing to contractors based solely on access to NRC facilities. Thus, I support the staff's proposal to ensure the testing extends to badged and unbadged NRC contractors who are in sensitive positions or admit to recent illegal drug use. The staff should ensure this includes all contractors who hold security clearances.

Because of the complex nature of the program, its actual implementation is critical in ensuring applicable law is closely followed. Staff should work closely with OGC on the implementation details.

#### Commissioner Lyons' Comments on SECY-07-0052

I approve the staff's recommendation, Option 2, for a 50 percent random drug testing rate for all NRC employees and for NRC contractors who are in sensitive positions as defined in the paper. I support the staff's full implementation of the recommendation in FY2008. I appreciate the staff efforts to consult other Federal agencies to better inform a recommendation for Commission deliberation.

Previously, in COMSECY-06-0043, staff noted that it was investigating a replacement for the existing drug testing tracking system that had not been modified since 1999. Staff should expeditiously replace/modify the existing tracking system to support the revised testing program.

I further support Commissioner McGaffigan's comment on the need for Congress to close the loophole to ensure testing of all contractor employees. I would further recommend that NRC staff engage the appropriate federal agencies to develop proposed legislation that could be provided to Congress for their consideration.
