SUBJECT: LICENSEE RESPONSE TO EARTHQUAKE ON APRIL 21, 2008

At approximately 12:38 a.m., CDT on April 21, 2008, a magnitude 4.0 earthquake on the Richter Scale occurred with an epicenter located about 37 miles north-northwest of Evansville, Indiana (source: U.S. Geological Survey). The epicenter was located about 110 miles north of the Paducah Gaseous Diffusion Plant (PGDP) in Paducah, KY and about 107 miles north of the Honeywell Metropolis Works uranium conversion plant in Metropolis, Illinois.

NRC Region II polled the Honeywell and Metropolis facilities and determined that the earthquake had not been felt at the Honeywell facility and by only a few individuals at PGDP. The resultant motion was not strong enough to activate the seismic sensing system at PGDP. Although not required to enter an emergency action procedure, PGDP personnel implemented their minor earthquake emergency procedure as a precaution, including walkdown inspections of plant systems. PGDP also suspended the use of liquid UF₆ cylinder-handling cranes pending completion of crane inspections. Assessment of the plant found no evidence of damage and PGDP has verified that the seismic sensing equipment continues to operate properly.

Routine licensed activities are being conducted at Honeywell and licensee staff took no action since the seismic activity was not felt at the facility. The licensee did not experience any alarms or other indications of abnormal plant conditions. The licensee's staff is considering the need for additional assessments of plant equipment to verify that plant systems were not affected by the recent seismic activity.

The State of Illinois and the Commonwealth of Kentucky have been informed. The information in this preliminary notification has been reviewed with licensee management.

NRC Region III contacted all operating reactors within Region III. Clinton Power Station was the only site to detect motion; however, the threshold for an emergency declaration was not met. The site conducted walkdowns and no evidence of damage was found. NRC Regions II and IV have not received any notifications from other licensed facilities located within their areas of responsibility.
