SUBJECT:	GENERIC COMMUNICATIONS DISTRIBUTION LIST

The Office of Nuclear Reactor Regulation, Division of Policy and Rulemaking, Generic Communications Branch (PGCB) staff at the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) currently uses a combination of electronic and standard mail (i.e., paper copies) for generic communication correspondence, such as Regulatory Issue Summaries, Information Notices, Generic Letters, and Bulletins. The PGCB staff is exploring opportunities to reduce the amount of standard mail the Federal government generates.

In support of this, the PGCB staff is informing those subscribers currently receiving <u>both</u> electronic and standard mail, that within 45 days of the date of this letter, they will be unsubscribed from the standard mailing list and will no longer receive generic communication correspondence through standard mail. They will continue to receive electronic generic communication correspondence.

The PGCB staff is also informing those subscribers currently receiving <u>only</u> standard mail distribution for generic communication correspondence of how to sign up for electronic distribution for generic communication correspondence. If you currently receive <u>only</u> standard mail and are willing to stop receiving standard mail and start receiving electronic mail, please provide a brief e-mail to Ms. Cathy Hawes, <u>Cathy.Hawes@nrc.gov</u>, within 45 days after the date of this letter, expressing this so she can remove you from the standard mail subscriber list. If no response is received, you will continue to receive generic communication correspondence through standard mail. In addition, please follow the instructions below to start receiving electronic generic communication correspondence.
