OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT ON DRAFT NUREG-1556, VOLUME 19, REVISION 1, "CONSOLIDATED GUIDANCE ABOUT MATERIALS LICENSES: GUIDANCE FOR AGREEMENT STATE LICENSEES ABOUT NRC FORM 241 'REPORT OF PROPOSED ACTIVITIES IN NON-AGREEMENT STATES, AREAS OF EXCLUSIVE FEDERAL JURISDICTION, OR OFFSHORE WATERS' AND GUIDANCE FOR NRC LICENSEES PROPOSING TO WORK IN AGREEMENT STATE JURISDICTION (RECIPROCITY)" (FSME-13-087)

**Purpose:** To provide the Agreement States with the opportunity to comment\* on the Office of Federal and State Materials and Environmental Management Programs (FSME) draft NUREG-1556, Volume 19, Revision 1, "Consolidated Guidance about Materials Licenses: Guidance for Agreement State Licensees about the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Form 241 'Report of Proposed Activities in Non-Agreement States, Areas of Exclusive Federal Jurisdiction, or Offshore Waters' and Guidance for NRC Licensees Proposing to Work in Agreement State Jurisdiction (Reciprocity)."

**Background:** The NRC is revising the licensing guidance in the NUREG-1556 series. The NRC last revised and published NUREG-1556, Volume 19, in December 2000. The document is intended for use by applicants, licensees and NRC staff, and is also available to the Agreement States.

**Discussion:** NUREG-1556, Volume 19, Revision 1, has been updated by a working group made up of NRC headquarters and regional representatives, to include safety culture, security of radioactive materials, protection of sensitive information and changes in regulatory policies and practices.
