OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT ON DRAFT REVISION TO THE OFFICE OF FEDERAL AND STATE MATERIALS AND ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT PROGRAMS PROCEDURE SA-700, PROCESSING AN AGREEMENT (FSME-14-016)

**Purpose**: To provide the Agreement States, non-Agreement States, and State Liaison Officers an opportunity to comment on the proposed revisions to the Office of Federal and State Materials and Environmental Management Programs (FSME) Procedure SA-700, Processing an Agreement.

**Background**: This procedure is being revised to update current practices and organizational changes.

**Discussion**: Enclosed for your review and comment is the draft revision to FSME Procedure SA-700, Processing an Agreement. This procedure provides guidelines and information (1) for a State or Commonwealth to use in preparing a request to enter into an Agreement with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC); (2) for NRC staff in reviewing requests from a Governor of a State or Commonwealth to enter into an Agreement with the NRC; (3) on the formal procedural steps for responding to a Governor's request for an Agreement; and (4) on the criteria for evaluating a Governor's proposed Agreement materials program.

We would appreciate receiving your comments<sup>1,2,3</sup> within 30 days from the date of this letter.
