**ACCEPTANCE:** Individuals listed in Enclosure 1 have been accepted for participation in the Safety Aspects of Well Logging (H-314) course. This course is scheduled to be presented April 23-27, 2018, at Schlumberger Technology Corporation's training facility, 210 Schlumberger Drive, Sugar Land, Texas, a Houston suburb.

<u>COURSE</u>: Please see our Web site, <a href="https://scp.nrc.gov/training.html">https://scp.nrc.gov/training.html</a> for the tentative course schedule and note that the course begins at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, April 23rd and ends at 12 noon on Friday, April 27th. You must attend the course in its entirety and receive a grade of at least 70 percent on the exam, which is administered on the last day, to receive credit for the course. LODGING AND TRAVEL: Please plan to arrive on Sunday, April 22nd and depart on Friday, April 27th. Students must make their own lodging and travel arrangements. If traveling by air, please contact El Sol Travel at 1-844-244-6694 for airline reservations, and indicate that the travel is "Invitational" for the NRC. Please select a fully refundable Government fare if one is available, and make sure that El Sol Travel correctly direct bills your fare to credit card ending 2835. You will need to allow one hour to get from the airport to the hotel. If the need arises and you must make a change, please contact Marcia Casby at (301) 415-6525.

Please complete the Travel Application Form which will be provided to you and submit to Marcia Casby, <u>AStrainingandtravel.Resource@nrc.gov</u>, at your earliest opportunity, but no later than Friday, February 23rd. The per diem for Sugar Land, Texas is \$137 for hotel and \$59 for meals and incidentals. Rental cars are not authorized for reimbursement. If you plan to drive, the Federal mileage reimbursement is 54.5 cents per mile.
