

Innovative Procurement Practices

Innovation in Acquisitions Innovation Incubator Est. FY23



The Federal Acquisition Regulation requires that all executive agencies designate an advocate for competition (i.e. Competition Advocate).

Responsibilities of the Competition Advocate

- Promoting full and open competition
- Challenging barriers to the acquisition of commercial products and commercial services
- Challenging barriers to full and open competition such as unnecessarily restrictive statements of work, unnecessarily detailed specifications
- Challenging barriers to the acquisition process

Competition Advocate established the Innovation Incubator with the following objectives:

- I2 serves as an advisory and consultative forum to support NRC Contracting Officers in identifying and evaluating emerging technologies and business models that have potential to drive acquisition innovation through adaptation of creative requirements development and evaluation approaches and mindful risk-taking, resulting in more efficient use of taxpayer dollars.
- 12 drives acquisition innovation to successfully execute emerging and well-established acquisition practices to save money, reduce time to delivery, increase quality, and/or improve customer and contractor satisfaction resulting in more efficient use of taxpayer.

Innovations

Technical Demonstrations

Technical demonstrations let NRC evaluation teams see, feel, and test solutions before buying. True capabilities can be revealed. Can be a stand-alone factor or an element of the oral presentation.

NRC evaluators hear directly from the vendor about their technical solutions/approaches or from key personnel on solutions to technical scenarios.

Remote Oral Presentations

Vendors get to demonstrate capabilities while not having to write onerous written proposals. Evaluators also save time in evaluations by not having to read lengthy written proposals

Affordability

Helps to identify a budget and ensures more competitive and realistic prices.

Gives vendors an estimated price or price range, to help vendors understand the scope of the work.

Helps ensure small businesses and new entrants have a better understanding of the anticipated magnitude of each effort so they can decide whether to invest significant bid and proposal costs.

Draft Performance Work Statements and Request for Proposals

Acquisition staff release draft Performance Work Statements or draft Request for Proposals and get feedback from the vendor community.

How to Prepare - Before Request for Proposal

- Stay in Touch with SBCR for upcoming opportunities and provide them capabilities packages.
- Respond to Draft Performance Work Statements and Request for Proposal with feedback, and questions. No question or comment is too small, and it is always received positively.



- Familiarize yourself with Department of Homeland Security's Procurement Innovation Lab Innovative Procurement techniques. (Periodic Table of Acquisition Innovations
- Ensure your company is registered in FEDCONNECT

How to Prepare – Proposal/Quotation Tips



The Federal Acquisition Regulation requires that all executive agencies designate an advocate for competition (i.e. Competition Advocate).

Performance Work Statement

• Thoroughly review Performance Work Statements and ensure your company and teaming partners/subcontractors can meet all PWS requirements. Instructions to Offeror/Quoters

- Focus on "shall" to ensure all material requirements of the solicitation are met."
- Ensure all instructions, page limits are understood and are feasible and if not ask during Q&A.
- Ensure all technology requirements can be met for Oral Presentations and Technology Demonstrations.
- Keep in mind that the many NRC solicitations do not require discussions/negotiations and can award based on initial proposals/quotations.

Evaluation Criteria

• Every word of evaluation criteria matters. Evaluation teams will evaluate everything that section M states will be evaluated.

ATTACHMENT 2 STATEMENT OF WORK (SOW)

C.1 Title of Project

Federal Identity, Credential, and Access Management (FICAM) Modernization and Operations and Maintenance of NRC Security System.

C.2 introduction

The contractor shall provide all personnel, equipment, supplies, facilities, transportation, tools, materials, supervision, and other items and non-personal services necessary to perform operations and maintenance of NRC Security System at all NRC facilities as defined in this SOW, except for those items specified as Government-furnished property and services. The contractor shall perform to the standards in this contract/order.

This contract will support the NRC physical security system including physical access control, closed circuit television (CCTV) and intrusion detection for the protection of NRC personnel, facilities and information. The contract will comprise of the following three main tasks:

Task 1. Operations and maintenance (O&M) of the agency-wide NRC security system in its current state. Services will include but are not limited to providing general upkeep of the system and its parts, commissioning and decommissioning equipment, providing/installing supplies and equipment, and providing training of the system.

Task 2. Implementation of the modernized Physical Access Control System (PACS) (hardware and software) to meet the Federal Information Processing Standard Publication 201-2 (FIPS 201-2) and Federal Identity, Credential, and Access Management (FICAM) transition plan requirements.

Task 3. O&M of the modernized security system.

C.3 Background

The NRC FICAM Transition Plan calls for the development of a Personal Identity Verification (PIV) Enablement Strategy for NRC facilities based on National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) Special Publication (SP) 800-116, FIPS 201-2 and "ICAM PIV in E-PACS Guidance v2.0.2" framework. As part of the FICAM transition plan, the NRC has been actively engaged in reviewing the NIST SP 800-116 guidance to improve the security access controls for all NRC facilities.

A separate order or contract will be competitively awarded to provide for (1) an independent assessment of the current security system, and (2) to develop recommendations for modernizing PACS to meet FIPS 201-2 compliance (herainafter "Order/Contract for the Modernized Design"). Modernizing PACS will utilize existing NRC system equipment to the greatest extent practical. The COR will evaluate the recommendations and determine the final modernized design solution that will be implemented as a task order under this FICAM Modernization and Operations and Maintenance of NRC Security System contract. Office of Small and Disadvantaged Business Utilization (OSDBU)



The Small Business Act as amended by Public Law 95-507, the Office of Small & Disadvantaged Business was established to:

- Advocate, within each Federal Executive Agency, for the <u>maximum practicable</u> use of all designated small business categories within the Federal Acquisition process.
- Ensure inclusion of small businesses as sources for goods and services in federal acquisitions as <u>prime contractors</u> and <u>subcontractors</u>.
- <u>Manage the small business utilization programs</u> for each respective organization.

What is a GSA Multiple Award Schedule?

- Through the MAS Program, GSA establishes long-term, governmentwide contracts with commercial firms to provide ordering activities with access to a wide variety of commercial supplies or services.
 - Multiple Award IDIQ (5-year award, three 5-year options)
 - Fixed Price EPA (Economic Price Adjustment)
 - Fair and reasonable pricing
 - Price reductions may be applied at the order level
 - Performance requirements established at the order level

GSA Multiple Award Schedules (MAS)

- The GSA Multiple Award Schedule (MAS) Program, also referred to as the "Schedule," is the premier contract vehicle for the federal government.
- The Schedule Program is a long term governmentwide contract between commercial suppliers and the federal government.
- Suppliers give federal, and in some cases state and local buyers (including tribal governments and some educational institutions), access to millions of commercial products and services at negotiated ceiling prices.
- Schedule purchases represent approximately 21 percent of overall federal procurement spending--approximately \$42 Billion per year.

What is a SIN?

- A Special Item Number, referred to as a SIN, is a number that identifies products and services that GSA Schedule contract holders offer to government buyers through a Schedule contract.
- SINs align with NAICS codes (North American Industry Classification System).

• If a SIN doesn't exist for the the product or service you are buying, it isn't purchased through the GSA Schedule contract.





- Does market research show that Federal, state and local governments are buying the types of products and services that your company offers?
- 2. Have you been in business for at least two years and have two years of financial statements to support this? (non startup springboard)
- 3. Do you have evidence of successful past performance?
- 4. Can you comply with the MAS contract terms and conditions?
- 5. Are your items Trade Agreement Act (TAA) compliant?
- 6. Do you have the resources to market your commercial products and services after the award of the contract?

GSA

Evaluation Criteria

- Must be in business for two years and you must provide two years of financial statements
 - Unless you are proposing under the <u>Startup Springboard</u>
- Ability to demonstrate acceptable
 - Corporate experience
 - Past Performance
 - Quality Control
 - Relevant Project Experience, as required by SIN
- Products or services must be commercially available
- Products or services must be compliant with the Trade Agreements Act (TAA)
- Proposed pricing is determined fair and reasonable



Startup Springboard

In lieu of the two-year corporate experience requirement, you may:

- Use professional experience of executives and key personnel as a substitute
- Use project experience of key personnel
- Provide financial documentation that demonstrates the company's financial responsibility in lieu of submitting two years of financial statements.



CHAIR HANSON AI TASKING


On October 30, 2023, <u>Chair Hanson tasked the EDO</u> with developing a broader list of NRC-specific AI use cases. Deliverables include:

- **Develop** a list of recommended AI applications that would benefit the NRC the most, and include a **summary** of
 - Proposed effort
 - Potential benefits and drawbacks
 - Projected cost and savings
 - Timeframe for implementation
 - Consider proper AI usage, policy implications, and data privacy need to ensure responsible and sustainable AI implementation
- The staff should **ensure** that ideas from **all offices are represented** and provide all this information to the Commission within 6 months (April 30, 2024).



RESPONSE PREPARATION

- Hosted a Senior Leadership Meeting at Microsoft in Rosslyn, VA to gain insights of their tools and capabilities on Al
- Hosted **25**+ **regional**, **office- and-division-level meetings** to educate NRC staff about the potential applications of Al
- Hosted **3 open houses** for all NRC offices to support development of their AI use cases
- Conducted 2 webinars on MS CoPilot and GitHub CoPilot to educate NRC staff about their potential applications
- All NRC offices have collectively submitted **62** use cases
- **14 NRC Data Scientists** reviewed the 62 use cases to validate data sources and categorized them into focus areas



PRELIMINARY INSIGHTS

- All **Regions** collectively coordinated to submit their respective use cases
- Most ideas leverage Generative AI* (e.g., ChatGPT, Microsoft CoPilot)
- **One-half of use cases** focus on aspects of data analytics or process automation rather than AI
- Confirmed the need for enhancing agency-wide data governance practices to support AI and advance NRC's Data Strategy
- Pioneering efforts in ADAMS Content Search and digitization have positioned the NRC at the forefront for early AI implementation



GENERAL AI USE CASE FINDINGS

- **Al Editor**: Use generative Al to improve document quality, write in plain language, and provide summaries.
- Al Search and Summary: Chatbot to provide domain-specific responses using agency data sets with summarization capabilities
- Al Search and Summary with Analysis Capability: Chatbot to generate documents based on agency datasets and integrate analytical capabilities



NEXT STEPS

- Formulate a comprehensive AI strategy across the NRC to enhance the current AI Strategic Plan by emphasizing an inward-directed plan that prioritizes agency readiness in anticipation of the upcoming OMB memorandum
- **Reaffirm commitment to NRC Data Priorities** to lay the groundwork for successful agency-wide AI implementation
- **Invest in foundational resources** for agency-wide Al implementation (e.g., IT infrastructure). Prioritize existing resources and request additional funding through the budget process
- **Build and expand AI capabilities** by leveraging existing hiring authorities and promoting workplace flexibilities to prioritize agency readiness for AI competence
- **Prioritize two use cases** to implement a copilot productivity tool for enhancing staff productivity and integrate Azure Open AI with ADAMS for foundational AI implementation across the agency
