Individuals with symptoms that can be common with other medical conditions and not specifically COVID-19 should follow care instructions from their healthcare provider. Individuals may enter the building if you reasonably believe the symptoms are unrelated to COVID-19.

If you had symptoms and were tested, is your test result negative, you have gone 24 hours with no fever without the use of fever reducing medication, or you reasonably believe the symptoms are unrelated to COVID-19?

2. Are you isolating or quarantining because you tested positive for COVID-19 and it has not been more than 5 full days since your positive test, and if you had symptoms you are not fever-free for 24 hours (without the use of fever-reducing medication) and your symptoms are not improving?

## 3. Were you exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19?

You should get tested, even if you don't develop symptoms, at least 5 days after you were exposed to someone who has tested positive for COVID-19. Watch for symptoms until 10 days after you were last exposed to someone with COVID-19.

If you develop symptoms, refrain from accessing a NRC or licensee facility and follow the precautions in the next row.
