Department for Radioactive Materials & Public Safety:

I realize that I am getting this letter off to you after the deadline for consumer responses (12/22/99) regarding the recycling of radioactive materials for household use. Please consider this letter to be my true and honest opinion on this critical issue. My first letter was forwarded to you from the Department of Public Affairs and was not my official opinion.
