The above referenced investigation was initiated on February 23, 1999 to determine whether a Chief Shift Operator (CSO) at the Nine Mile Point Nuclear Station, Unit 1, had been discriminated against for having engaged in protected activities. Specifically, the CSO claimed that she had been forced to accept a demotion due to circumstances resulting from having raised safety concerns in November 1996 and filing a complaint with the Department of Labor in October 1997.

In its report dated August 25, 1999 the Office of Investigations could not substantiate that the CSO was discriminated against as a result of having engaged in protected activities. We will consider the matter closed unless we receive a different view within three weeks of the date of this memorandum.
