Agency Information Collection Activities: Proposed Collection; Comment Request

AGENCY: Nuclear Regulatory Commission.

ACTION: Notice of pending NRC action to submit an information collection request to OMB and solicitation of public comment.

SUMMARY:

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is preparing a submittal to OMB for review of continued approval of information collections under the provisions of the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1995 (44 U.S.C. Chapter 35).

Information pertaining to the requirement to be submitted:

- The title of the information collection: Application/Permit for Use of the
 Two White Flint (TWFN) Auditorium.
- 2. Current OMB approval number: 3150-0181.
- How often the collection is required: Each time public use of the NRC auditorium is requested.



- 4. Who is required or asked to report: Members of the public requesting use of the NRC Auditorium.
- 5. The number of annual respondents: 5.
- 6. The number of hours needed annually to complete the requirement or request: 1.25 hours (15 minutes per request).
- 7. Abstract: In accordance with the Public Buildings Act of 1959, an agreement was reached between the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (MPPC), the General Services Administration (GSA) and the NRC, that the NRC auditorium will be made available for public use. Public users of the auditorium will be required to complete NRC Form 590 (Application/Permit for Use of Two White Flint North (TWFN) Auditorium). The information is needed to allow for administrative and security review, scheduling, and to make a determination that there are no anticipated problems with the requester prior to utilization of the facility is used.

DRAFT OMB SUPPORTING STATEMENT FOR NRC FORM 590 APPLICATION/PERMIT FOR USE OF THE TWO WHITE FLINT NORTH (TWFN) AUDITORIUM (3150-0181)

Description of the Information Collection

The U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) has an auditorium which is available for use by the public. In accordance with the Public Buildings Act of 1959, an agreement was reached between the Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission (MPPC), the General Services Administration (GSA) and the NRC, which states that the auditorium will be made available for public use. Members of the public who wish to use the auditorium must complete NRC Form 590, Application/Permit for Use of Two White Flint North (TWFN) Auditorium, which must be approved prior to public use of the facility.

The form requests identifying information about the requesting applicant/organization, purpose of use, certification for solicitation of funds, documentation of authority to represent an organization, acknowledgment of liability for damages, and a checklist of service needs and allows for administrative and security reviews and final approval for use of the facility.

A. JUSTIFICATION

- 1. Need for and Practical Utility Agency Use of the Collection of Information. The NRC Form 590, Application/Permit for Use of Two White Flint North (TWFN) Auditorium would be reviewed by the Division of Administrative Services and Division of Facilities and Security. The information is needed to allow for administrative and security review, facilitate scheduling, and to make a determination that there are no anticipated problems with the requester prior to utilization of the facility.
- 2. <u>Agency Use of Information</u>. The NRC uses the information for processing requests made for use of the auditorium.
- 3. Reduction of Burden through Information Technology. There are no legal obstacles to reducing the burden associated with this information collection.
- 4. <u>Effort to Identify Duplication and Use Similar Information</u>. The NRC Form 590 is unique to NRC in that it supports an agreement between the NRC, GSA and MPPC that the auditorium will be made available for public use. The Information Requirements Control Automated System (IRCAS) was searched and no duplication was found. Information to be provided by the public-user is not otherwise available.
- 5. <u>Effort to Reduce Small Business Burden</u>. The collection represents the minimum information required to assess and approve a member of the public's request to use a government facility. The burden cannot be further reduced.
- 6. Consequences to Federal Program or Policy Activities if the Collection Is Not Conducted or is Conducted Less Frequently. The frequency of collection is "as the facility is needed by the requester." Therefore, this is the minimum frequency that the information can be requested. If the information is not collected, the public will not have access to the NRC auditorium.

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- 7. <u>Circumstances Which Justify Variation from OMB Guidelines</u>. Not applicable.
- 8. <u>Consultations Outside the NRC</u>. The opportunity for public comment will be published in the Federal Register.
- 9. Payment or Gift to Respondents. Not applicable.
- 10. <u>Confidentiality of the Information</u>. NRC provides no pledge of confidentiality for this collection of information. To the extent information is business confidential, procedures are in place to protect the information from improper disclosure.
- 11. <u>Justification for Sensitive Questions</u>. Normally sensitive information considered private or personal is not required or requested.
- 12. Estimated Burden and Burden Hour Cost. The total annual public burden for completing NRC Form 590 is 1.25 hours at a cost of \$175.00. The annual burden and cost estimates were derived from experience during the past three years with the number of public users' requests to use the facility and the approximate number of hours each requester would have to expend to complete the form (5 requesters x .25 hr. per request = 1.25 hours x \$140/hour = \$175).
- 13. Estimate of Other Additional Costs. None.
- 14. <u>Estimated Annualized Cost to the Federal Government</u>. The cost to the agency for processing the proposed NRC Form 590 was derived from experience during the past three years with Administrative Services and Facilities and Security personnel would expend an average of 1 hour to review each request for a total cost to the agency (5 requests X 1 hour X \$140/hr = \$700). The cost is recovered by the facility rental fee.
- 15. Reason for Changes in Burden or Cost. No change in burden for current clearance.
- 16. Publication for Statistical Use. Results will not be tabulated or published.
- 17. Reason for Not Displaying the Expiration Date. The expiration date is displayed.
- 18. Exceptions to the Certification Statement. The expiration date is displayed.
