NRC'S NUCLEAR SAFETY RESEARCH REVIEW COMMITTEE
TO MEET APRIL 29-30 IN ROCKVILLE, MD.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Nuclear Safety Research Review Committee will hold a technical meeting April 29-30 at the Holiday Inn Crowne Plaza, 1750 Rockville Pike, Rockville, MD.

The meeting, which is open to the public, will begin at 8:30 a.m. on April 29 and at 8:00 a.m. the next day.

The 12-member committee, established in 1988, advises the NRC's Director of Nuclear Regulatory Research on matters of overall management importance. The committee is composed of senior experts in nuclear engineering or science who are qualified to provide technical advice on nuclear regulatory safety research applicable to NRC-licensed nuclear power plants and other licensed facilities. It meets about three times a year in the Washington, D.C., area or at a research institution.

On April 29, the committee will discuss the NRC's research program on digital instrumentation and controls for nuclear power plants. The next day, committee discussions will include the NRC's highest-priority research areas, skills needed for review of advanced reactors, appropriate level of NRC research and the use of probabilistic risk assessment results.

Other aspects of the meeting, including the opportunity for the public to comment, are described in a Notice of Meeting published in the Federal Register on April 6.

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
