NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON REACTOR SAFEGUARDS TO MEET DECEMBER 7-8 IN ROCKVILLE, MD.

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards has scheduled a technical meeting December 7-8 in Rockville, Maryland.

The meeting, which is open to the public, will be held in Conference Room 2B3 in the NRC's Two White Flint North Building at 11545 Rockville Pike.

As part of the meeting, the committee will meet with NRC Chairman Shirley Ann Jackson from 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on December 8 in Room 2B3 to discuss her regulatory views and philosophy. Following that meeting, the ACRS will meet with the Chairman and Commissioner Kenneth C. Rogers from 1:30 p.m. to 3:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Conference Room, White Flint North Building, 11555 Rockville Pike. They will discuss items of mutual interest, including fire protection, nondestructive examination techniques and a study by the National Academy of Sciences and National Research Council regarding digital instrumentation and control.

Although meetings of the ACRS are open to the public, they are not part of the NRC's public hearing process. The ACRS, an advisory group to the Commission, conducts independent, highly technical reviews of safety considerations related to nuclear facilities. While anyone may attend, the committee will consider only oral or written statements arranged in advance and limited to specific matters set forth in a Notice of Meeting published in the November 28 edition of the Federal Register.

The meeting may include closed sessions, if required, to discuss proprietary information.
