The state of Louisiana and the United States Atomic Energy Commission entered into an agreement that discontinued certain aspects of the commission's regulatory responsibility and authority within the state. This agreement became effective May 1, 1967, pursuant to Section 274 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 as amended (the Act), and is referred to as the "274b. Agreement", which established Louisiana as an Agreement State. At the same time, the state and the commission also entered into an agreement pursuant to Section 274i. of the Act, which permitted the state to perform inspections or other functions in federal waters adjacent to Louisiana on behalf of the commission (now the Nuclear Regulatory Commission).

Since the agreement was executed, the state has conducted some routine inspections, and investigations of incidents in offshore waters. It should be noted, however, that these activities have not been conducted by the state in recent years. Difficulties with arranging transportation and a lack of both financial and personnel resources have made it burdensome to conduct field activities for the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission in offshore waters. This has led us to conclude that the 274i. Agreement is no longer needed and should be terminated effective 30 days from receipt of this letter.

Louisiana's 274b. Agreement with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission has, and continues to be, a mutually beneficial arrangement. Termination of the 274i. Agreement does not in any way affect our Agreement State status. We look forward to maintaining our current relationship of cooperation and assistance.
