

We depend on you to insure that NO contaminated materials ever enter the consumer marketplace.





Please ensure the Nuclear Regulatory Commission examines the antitrust issues involved in British Energy's attempts to buy 20 U.S. nuclear power plants through its subsidiary, Amergen. I am uncomfortable with a single private company controlling a large percentage of our country's nuclear power plants.

I believe that our electrical generation should all remain owned by U.S. Companies. Hence no foreign owned company should own any nuclear generation plants in the U.S..
