
I am writing in support of an application by Southern Nuclear Operating Company, a subsidiary of the Southern Company, for a twenty-year extension of the operating terms for Plant Hatch Units 1 and 2, near Baxley, Georgia.

Although it is not located in my district, Plant Hatch provides a vital source of power to the vast majority of electricity customers in the state of Georgia. It is jointly owned by Georgia Power Company, Oglethorpe Power Company, the Municipal Electric Authority of Georgia, and the City of Dalton, Georgia. Plant Hatch is a critical component of the state of Georgia's effort to maintain a reliable, balanced, and environmentally sound fuel mix. In an area that has been hit hard economically by drought, low farm prices, and textile flight overseas, Plant Hatch provides jobs for nearly 1,000 citizens in the state of Georgia and is an important component in the economic viability of the region.

As I am sure you are aware, Plant Hatch has routinely been recognized as one of the safest and most productive nuclear plants in the country. I can personally attest that the management has gone to great lengths to work with the surrounding community and keep the citizens informed of plant status and activities.
