I write to you in opposition to the continuing operation of Millstone Nuclear Power Plant in Waterford, Connecticut. I hope you will use your considerable power as the NRC Chair to help shut down this dangerous plant

I am disturbed to learn that Northeast Utilities, the parent company of Millstone, is requesting permission to double the fuel racks for storing spent fuel rods.
