Dear Mr. Bailey:

In accordance with the Section G.5, Task Order Procedures, of the subject contract, this letter definitizes Task Order No. 3. This effort shall be performed in accordance with the enclosed Statement of Work and the Contractor's technical proposal dated March 14, 2000, with revisions dated April 11, 2000 which is incorporated by reference and made a part of this task order. Verbal authorization to proceed with performance was given by the Contracting Officer on March 3, 2000 with a not to exceed spending limit of \$5,000.

Task Order number 3 shall be in effect from April 12, 2000, through April 11, 2001, with a cost ceiling of \$14,427. The amount of \$13,236 represents reimbursable costs, the amount of \$1,191 represent the fixed fee.

The obligated amount shall, at no time, exceed the task order ceiling. When and if the amount(s) paid and payable to the Contractor hereunder shall equal the obligated amount, the Contractor shall not be obligated to continue performance of the work unless and until the Contracting Officer shall increase the amount obligated with respect to this task order. Any work undertaken by the Contractor in excess of the obligated amount specified above is done so at the Contractor's sole risk.

This task order obligates funds in the amount of \$14,427, of which \$13,236 represents reimbursable costs, \$1,191 represents the fixed fee. Accounting data for this task order is as follows:

**STATEMENT OF WORK
TASK ORDER NUMBER 3:
DECOMMISSIONING FINANCIAL ASSURANCE CASEWORK ASSISTANCE**

1.0 BACKGROUND

Assist NMSS staff in the review of NRC guidance for implementing financial assurance regulations in Chapter 10 of the code of Federal Regulations. These requirements apply to uranium recovery facilities (10 CFR Part 40), low-level radioactive waste disposal facilities (10 CFR Part 61), and certain other materials licensees (10 CFR Parts 30, 40, 70 and 72).

2.0 OBJECTIVE

The objective is to review existing financial assurance guidance for possible revisions based on casework experience.

3.0 WORK REQUIRED

Utilizing NRC casework experience, the contractor shall review the existing financial assurance guidance, make recommendations for revisions, and provide technical support for any revisions. The guidances include the following:

1. Regulatory Guide 3.66, "Standard Format and Content of Financial Assurance Mechanisms Required for Decommissioning under 10 CFR Parts 30, 40, 70, and 72."
2. NUREG-1337, Rev. 1, "Standard Review Plan for the Review of Financial Assurance Mechanisms for Decommissioning under 10 CFR Parts 30, 40, 70, and 72."
3. NUREG-1199, Rev. 1, "Standard Format and Content of a License Application for a Low-Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Facility".
4. NUREG-1200, Rev. 1, "Standard Review Plan for the Review of a License Application for a Low-Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Facility" and
5. "Technical Position on Financial Assurances for Reclamation, Decommissioning, and Long-Term Surveillance and Control of Uranium Recovery Facilities."

Technical support will include, but not be limited to, analysis of comments, addressing comments received on guidance documents, and revising guidance documents. With regard to the revised Technical Position for uranium recovery licensees, the number of comments is uncertain. If the comments require substantial additional research to address, then the level of effort required to address the comments received on the revised Technical Position may have to be revised.

Revision to NUREG-1199 and NUREG-1200 are not anticipated at this time.

4.0 REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Comments and recommendations from the ICF reviews shall be submitted to the NRC Technical Project Manager (TPM) in the form a letter report within 30 days of completion of the reviews or as directed by the TPM.

5.0 WORK PLACEMENT

The TPM will forward to ICF the guidance documents to be reviewed. At the time documents are forwarded to ICF, the NRC Division of Contracts will also be notified.

6.0 TRAVEL

Travel for this review may include up to 9 trips from ICF to NRC Headquarters.

7.0 NRC-FURNISHED MATERIALS

Financial assurance guidance documents for review will be provided to ICF directly from the TPM.

8.0 ESTIMATED LEVEL OF EFFORT

The estimated level of effort is 3.0 man-weeks.

9.0 PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

The period of performance is one year from date of task order award.
