APPLICANTS' MOTION FOR DISMISSAL OF PROCEEDING

AmerGen Energy Company, LLC ("AmerGen"), Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation ("Niagara Mohawk"), and New York State Electric & Gas Corporation ("NYSEG"), respectfully request the Commission to dismiss this proceeding regarding the proposed transfer of NRC licenses for Nine Mile Point Units 1 and 2 held by Niagara Mohawk and NYSEG to AmerGen. On April 25, 2000, the New York State Public Service Commission ("PSC") issued an order urging the owners of the Nine Mile Point units to determine the market value of these units through a competitive bidding process. At the same time, the PSC approved the withdrawal of NYSEG's and Niagara Mohawk's petitions for PSC authorization to transfer their ownership interests in the Nine Mile Point units to AmerGen. Accordingly, as described in the attached letter to the NRC Director of Nuclear Reactor Regulation, Applicants have withdrawn their application for transfer of the NRC licenses for Nine Mile Point held by Niagara Mohawk and

NYSEG. As a result, there is no need for a hearing in connection with that application, and

By the above-referenced Application, AmerGen Energy Company, LLC ("AmerGen"), Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation ("Niagara Mohawk"), and New York State Electric & Gas Corporation ("NYSEG"), requested NRC approval

for transfer of the NRC licenses for Nine Mile Point Units 1 and 2 held by Niagara Mohawk and NYSEG to AmerGen.¹

Recent developments before the New York Public Service Commission ("PSC") have led Applicants to decide not to proceed with the license transfers described in their application at this time. On April 25, 2000, the New York PSC issued an order urging the owners of the Nine Mile Point units to determine the market value of these units through a competitive bidding process. At the same time, the PSC approved withdrawal of NYSEG's and Niagara Mohawk's petitions for PSC authorization to transfer their ownership interests in the Nine Mile Point units to AmerGen. As a result, there is no reasonable prospect that the transfer of these interests will proceed in accordance with the schedule anticipated at the time Applicants filed their application for NRC approval of the transfer of the Nine Mile Point licenses to AmerGen. Accordingly, Applicants hereby withdraw their September 10, 1999 Application for Order and Conforming Administrative License Amendments for License Transfers for License Numbers DPR-63 and NPF-69.

Notwithstanding the withdrawal of the current application, AmerGen will participate in the competitive bidding process suggested by the New York PSC. In the event that this process leads any of the current owners of Nine Mile Point to transfer their interests to AmerGen, AmerGen would submit a renewed application for transfer of the Nine Mile Point licenses. AmerGen therefore requests the NRC Staff to retain the September 10, 1999 application, and the analyses that have been performed in connection with processing that application, so that in the event a similar application is filed in the future, the knowledge gained and effort expended by the NRC Staff can be applied to the processing of such an application and support the efficient use of both Staff and applicant resources in evaluating the application.

Collectively, Niagara Mohawk, NYSEG, and AmerGen are the "Applicants." Niagara Mohawk is the sole owner of Nine Mile Point Unit 1, holds a 41% undivided ownership interest in Unit 2, and is the licensed operator of both units. NYSEG holds an 18% undivided ownership interest in Unit 2.
