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### STATEMENT OF WORK

# **BACKGROUND**

Executive Order 12196 (Occupational Safety and Health Programs for Federal Employees) Part 1960 requires all federal agencies to perform annual workplace inspections. These inspections shall be performed by personnel with equipment and competence to recognize hazards. The contractor shall provide three references of client personnel verifying their level of performance.

## SCOPE OF WORK

- The contractor shall perform a full comprehensive safety, health and fire protection survey of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission Headquarters buildings located at 11545 and 11555 Rockville Pike, Rockville, Maryland; Warehouse building at 5000 Boiling Brook Parkway, Rockville, Maryland; and the Gelman building (Public Document Room) at 2120 L Street, N.W., Washington, DC. The survey shall include all office space, mechanical rooms, electrical closets, storage rooms, fire pump rooms, etc.
- 2. The contractor shall review safety and health surveys and abatement plans from the previous year while performing their inspection to ensure that all previous safety, health and fire protection deficiencies were abated. Deficiencies still in existence shall be noted in their surveys. These surveys and plans will be furnished to the contractor by the NRC Project Office.
- 3. The contractor shall schedule a pre-inspection and post-inspection conference with the Agency Safety and Health Manager and Facilities Management personnel.
- The contract shall use the following codes and standards in identifying deficiencies:
  Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) Codes of Federal Regulations
  (CFR) 29 CFR 1960, 1910 and 1926, all National Fire Protection Association (NFPA)
  codes, all American Standards Institute (ANSI) standards, and General Services
  Administration (GSA) Occupational Safety and Health Handbook and recognized safe
  work practices.
- 5. The contractor shall provide inspectors that are certified by the American Society of Safety Engineers as a Certified Safety Professional (CSP), and have a minimum of seven years in performing safety and health surveys in industrial and office setting.
- 6. The contractor shall provide all necessary materials to conduct the inspection.

## **DELIVERABLES**

- 1. The contractor shall complete each inspection within five (5) working days.
- 2. Within ten (10) working days, the contractor shall provide a detailed Safety and Health Report, for each building (4 draft reports and 4 final reports), that lists all deficiencies identified by description, location, the standard violated, and recommendations for corrective action. Additionally, the report shall include the class of the hazard, a hazard rating, and a proposed abatement schedule for each deficiency. All reports shall be provided to the NRC Project Officer (Agency Safety and Health Program Manager).

- 3. The NRC Project Officer shall provide comments back to the contractor within 11 working days. Comments will consist of addressing deficiencies identified in the contractor report that need clarification concerning code site, area of deficiency and corrective action. The contractor shall be available to meet for a minimum of one-hour to support any deficiency questioned.
- 4. Within seven (7) working days from receipt of NRC's comments, the contract shall provide the final report the NRC Project Officer.

# PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

The period of performance for completion of this project shall be five (5) months from the date of award.

The contractor shall contact the NRC Project Officer within one (1) day after notification of award to schedule the inspections.

The Government must exercise its postacceptance rights—
- (1) Within a reasonable period of time after the defect was discovered or should have been discovered; and
- (2) Before any substantial change occurs in the condition of the item, unless the change is due to the defect in the item.
- (e) Excusable delays. The Contractor shall be liable for default unless nonperformance is caused by an occurrence beyond the reasonable control of the Contractor and without its fault or negligence, such as acts of God or the public enemy, acts of the

Government in either its sovereign or contractual capacity, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, unusually severe weather, and delays of common carriers. The Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing as soon as it is reasonably possible after the commencement of any excusable delay, setting forth the full particulars in connection therewith, shall remedy such occurrence with all reasonable dispatch, and shall promptly give written notice to the Contracting Officer of the cessation of such occurrence.

- (f) Termination for the Government's convenience. The Government reserves the right to terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for its sole convenience. In the event of such termination, the Contractor shall immediately stop all work hereunder and shall immediately cause any and all of its suppliers and subcontractors to cease work. Subject to the terms of this contract, the Contractor shall be paid a percentage of the contract price reflecting the percentage of the work performed prior to the notice of termination, plus reasonable charges that the Contractor can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Government, using its standard record keeping system, have resulted from the termination. The Contractor shall not be required to comply with the cost accounting standards or contract cost principles for this purpose. This paragraph does not give the Government any right to audit the Contractor's records. The Contractor shall not be paid for any work performed or costs incurred that reasonably could have been avoided.
- (g) Termination for cause. The Government may terminate this contract, or any part hereof, for cause in the event of any default by the Contractor, or if the Contractor fails to comply with any contract terms and conditions, or fails to provide the Government, upon request, with adequate assurances of future performance. In the event of termination for cause, the Government shall not be liable to the Contractor for any amount for supplies or services not accepted, and the Contractor shall be liable to the Government for any and all rights and remedies provided by law. If it is determined that the Government improperly terminated this contract for default, such termination shall be deemed a termination for convenience.
- (h) Warranty. The Contractor warrants and implies that the items delivered hereunder are merchantable and fit for use for the particular purpose described in this contract.

## A.5 ELECTRONIC PAYMENT

The Debt Collection Improvement Act of 1996 requires that all payments except IRS tax refunds be made by Electronic Funds Transfer. Only after the Office of the Controller has processed the contractor's sign-up form will the contractor be eligible to receive payments.
