On A oril 1, 2000, the NRC completed an inspection at the Hatch Nuclear Plant. The enclosed integrated inspection report presents the results of that inspection. During the eight-week period covered by this inspection, the conduct of activities at the Hatch Nuclear Plant was generally characterized by safety-conscious operation, adequate maintenance practices and appropriate engire ering support to the plant.

Base I upon the results of this inspection, the NRC has determined that three violations of NRC requirements occurred. These violations are being treated as Non-Cited Violations (NCVs), consistent with Section VII.B.1.a of the Enforcement Policy. These NCVs are described in the encice ed integrated report. If you contest the violation or severity level of these NCVs, you shou I provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for enial, to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Nast Ington, D.C. 20555-0001, with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region II, and the Director, Office of Enforcement, USNRC, Washington D.C. 20555-0001.
