NRC Regulatory Issue Summary 2000-04 Response

This letter forwards the Beaver Valley Power Station (BVPS) response to the Regulatory Issue Summary 2000-04 request for information regarding an estimate of the number of new licensing actions expected to be submitted in the remainder of Fiscal Year (FY) 2000 and FY 2001. As requested, those licensing actions expected to generate complex reviews, such as power uprate requests and license renewal requests, are identified by a brief title.

The attached enclosure provides a restatement of the NRC information request followed by the Beaver Valley Power Station response.

The previous estimate provided by BVPS on July 25, 1999, identified licensing actions for best estimate LOCA analyses for FY 2000 (for Unit 2) and FY 2001 (for Unit 1). These actions, in addition to updating the small break LOCA analyses, are now projected for June 2002 in conjunction with the power uprate project. Please note that this revises the schedule for both large and small break LOCA analyses originally provided in our 10 CFR 50.46 submittal dated March 19, 1999.
