Dear Chariman Meserve and Commissioners:

As a member of the Coalition of Elected Officials Within a 10-Mile Radius of Con Edison's Indian Point 2 Nuclear Plant in Buchanan, New York, I demand that Con Edison immediately replace its steam generators. In the wake of the February 15, 2000 radioactive leak, this action is imperative. I call upon the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to take whatever action necessary to achieve this result.

Nearby Indian Point 3, operated by the New York Power Authority, replaced its same Westinghouse manufactured steam generators in 1989 at a cost of \$110 million. Meanwhile, for the past 25 years, Con Edison continues to operate the oldest Westinghouse generators of the kind in the Country.

We who live in the area are concerned about our health and safety. Repeated servicing of these aging generators has not prevented a significant Level 2 radioactive leak from occurring. I believe that the answer is to stop fixing and start installing the new generators that are already on site.
