Dear Ms. Ratcliff:

I am writing to confirm that Dr. Craig Turner gained considerable clinical experience at The Western Pennsylvania Hospital in Nuclear Cardiology. This involved six months of dedicated rotations during his cardiology fellowship which spanned from July, 1992 through June, 1995. During this time, Dr. Turner actively participated in the following procedures:

308 stress myocardial perfusion studies
247 pharmacologic myocardial perfusion studies
250 radionuclide ventriculograms ("MUGA")
14 rest/redistribution thallium myocardial imaging

4 pyrophosphate scans
1 first pass study
2 stress MUGA studies

He gained considerable experience in examining patients and reviewing their histories, selecting suitable radiopharmaceuticals, collaborating with his preceptors (both authorized users of radioisotopes, including myself) in interpretation of test results and follow-up.

Additionally, Dr. Turner visited the Syncor radiopharmacy and was involved with radiopharmaceutical preparation and elution of Technetium 99m-Molybdenum-99 generator. He was involved with quality control of the cameras in the department including daily floods, bar phantoms, SPECT uniformity correction, SPECT center of rotation, and Hot Lab quality control (dose calibrator, package receipts and returns, etc.).

* In total, Dr. Turner spent more than 1,000 supervised hours in this facility during his clinical preceptorship and has developed a thorough understanding of Nuclear Cardiology.
