SUMMARY OF MEETING WITH THE NUCLEAR ENERGY INSTITUTE

(NEI) ON INDUSTRY'S COMMENTS ON CHAPTER 4,

"IDENTIFICATION OF TIME-LIMITED AGING ANALYSES," OF THE DRAFT STANDARD REVIEW PLAN FOR THE REVIEW OF LICENSE RENEWAL (SRP-LR) APPLICATIONS FOR NUCLEAR POWER

PLANTS

On July 5, 2000, representatives from NEI met with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff in Rockville, Maryland. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss industry's comments on Chapter 4, "Identification of Time-Limited Aging Analyses," of the Draft Standard Review Plan for the Review of License Renewal Applications for Nuclear Power Plants (SRP-LR). NEI provided its comments in a June 15, 2000, letter. Attachment 1 is a list of meeting attendees. The staff used a handout when discussing NEI comments regarding Section 4.5 of the Draft SRP-LR (Attachment 2).

The staff asked the industry to clarify certain NEI comments on the draft SRP-LR. NRC staff and NEI representatives discussed comments on each section of Chapter 4 including the following;

- Time-Limited Aging Analyses (TLAAs) and NEI's previous proposal for a new Chapter X to address TLAAs in the Generic Aging Lessons Learned (GALL) Report,
- Generic Safety Issue (GSI) 190, "Fatigue Evaluation of Metal Components for 60-Year Plant Life," should remain as part of Section 4.3, "Metal Fatigue,"
- Need of Table 4.4-1, "Environmental Qualification (EQ) Program Evaluation and Technical Basis," in the GALL Report,
- Fatigue design of containment liner,
- Aging management of containment tendon prestressed through a surveillance program,
- EQ rule regarding DOR Guidelines and NUREG-0588 Category I and Category II requirements,
- As the result of this meeting, the staff stated that it would consider NEI's comments on preparing the draft SRP-LR for issuance for public comment in August, and

 NEI also indicated that it would be developing and submitting a revision 2 to the NEI 95-10, "Industry Guideline for Implementing the Requirements of 10 CFR Part 54 - The License Renewal Rule."

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


Fig 3 Trend of Prestressing Forces in Horizontal Tendons
