I currently serve as the Section 12 Commander, where I continue as the State Hazardous Materials Coordinator ( as described below \*\*\* ), and serve as Commander of the motor carrier enforcement activities in the southern portion of the state.

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\*\*\* I was assigned as State Hazardous Materials Coordinator after the retirement of the Lieutenant who was the coordinator at that time. In this position I coordinate the activities of the State's hazardous materials team which consists of 18 troopers, specially trained and equipped to respond to hazardous materials emergencies of all classifications. This team is mandated through Executive Order as on-scene coordinators. The focus for our technician level responses is geared to pick-up where the local capabilities end. This means that along the four counties of the Wasatch Front the local fire departments handle most of the incidents; however, Utah Highway Patrol Hazmat has primary responsibility for incidents occurring on the interstate. Off the Wasatch front, with exception of a couple counties which have varying response capability, we are the primary responders to hazardous materials emergencies.

In this team there is a crew of five full-time personnel who, in addition to the response issues, spend significant time working with the local agencies through the Local Emergency Planning Committees to provide training to local responders, and assist in developing local response capabilities.
