SUBJECT: INDUSTRY REPORTS

Attached are two documents which were received by NRC staff in the course of its review of matters related to the February 15, 2000 steam generator tube leak at Indian Point, Unit 2 (IP2). The first documents, an E-mail dated May 1, 2000, from John Fuoto to a number of addressees, incorporates a report entitled "Emergency Response Organization Weaknesses During an Alert, OE10937." The designator OE 109397 identifies the document as one of a series of documents in the Institute for Nuclear Power Operation (INPO) event reporting network. The document was received by NRC staff from several sources, including contacts at the Federal Emergency Management Agency and "The Journal News" newspaper (a periodical published near the Indian Point 2 site).

The second document is a report entitled "Emergency Preparedness Weaknesses During an Alert, OE 11062," dated June 5, 2000. This report is also one of a series of documents in the INPO event reporting network. This document was received by NRC staff from contacts at Consolidated Edison, the licensee for IP2.

OEDO staff has discussed these reports with INPO representatives including the applicability of the standing memorandum of understanding between NRC and INPO. The staff specifically discussed the fact that OE 10937 was a document that was clearly out in the public domain and that therefore, there was no basis for requesting its withholding from public disclosure by NRC staff. INPO representatives and OEDO staff also discussed the similarity of OE 10937 and OE 11062. Based on these discussions, INPO indicated that, in this instance, it does not object to placement of both of these documents in the NRC's public document room (PDR).
