

Since the Federal Government, some of the Goshute Indian Tribe and a consortium calling itself the Private Fuel Storage Company are so all fired eager to store heavy duty nuclear wastes in Utah "temporarily", I have a suggestion.

Expand the scope of the EIS to that area downwind on the reservation lands where we, the citizens of Utah, propose to build, at our cost, an excellent community to house the policy makers and profit mongers of this project, governmental, tribal and commercial. The storage company headquarters, all its officers and board members, together with their families, (we'll house best friends too), are expected to be the first inhabitants. This is to enable all of you considerate citizens to put your lives, and the lives of your loved ones, exactly where your mouths, regulations, and convictions propose to put our loved ones and us. We need you as our shining shield.

This will profit the Tribe, current Tooele County Commissioners, Company, and Federal Government's participating Agency officials with a whole bunch of free rent housing and utilities. The only restrictive residence rule will be that not more than one member of a family will be able to leave the precincts of the community at any time for the duration of described nuclear storage in our state, however long that might be. This is not to be presumed to be anything more than your absolute guarantee of our and our descendant's peace of mind. Would any fair individual expect any less?
