Our percentage of population tested from January 1, 2000 to June 30, 2000 was 27.29%.

Five of the positive Marijuana drug test results were below the DHHS/NRC initial screening level of 100 NG/ML. Our initial screening level for Marijuana is 50 NG/ML.
