Subject: Additional Information Regarding Application for Indirect License Transfers

In the Reference (1) and (2) letters, we requested NRC consent to the indirect transfers of AmerGen Energy Company's (AmerGen) NRC operating licenses for Three Mile Island Station, Unit 1 (TMI Unit 1), Clinton Power Station (CPS) and Oyster Creek Generating Station (Oyster Creek) and the direct or indirect transfer of Vermont Yankee Nuclear Power Corporation (VYNPC) or AmerGen Vermont, LLC's (AmerGen Vermont) NRC operating license for Vermont Yankee Power Station (Vermont Yankee). The transfers would occur during an interim period

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during which PECO Energy Company (PECO) would become a direct, wholly-owned subsidiary of Exelon Corporation (i.e., Exelon) and would continue to hold its existing 50% ownership interest in AmerGen until the transfer of this interest to Exelon Generation Company, LLC (EGC) occurs. During this interim period, we also indicated that the management and business of AmerGen and AmerGen Vermont, and their respective Management Committees and officers would be unchanged or consistent with the descriptions of these organizations previously provided in earlier license transfer applications and subsequent submittals, in particular those relating to the transfer of PECO's 50% ownership interest to EGC.

It has been determined that during the interim period, Oliver D. Kingsley, Jr., the current President and Chief Nuclear Officer (CNO) of Commonwealth Edison (ComEd) Company's Nuclear Generation Group, will also become the CNO and Chairman of the Management Committees of both AmerGen and AmerGen Vermont. In addition, Jack Skolds, ComEd's Chief Operating Officer (COO), will become the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of both AmerGen and AmerGen Vermont, reporting to Mr. Kingsley. Messrs. Kingsley and Skolds are both U.S. citizens. The Management Committees of AmerGen and AmerGen Vermont will remain the entities with final decision making authority concerning matters that involve the AmerGen and AmerGen Vermont nuclear plants, respectively. Accordingly, AmerGen and AmerGen Vermont will retain authority and responsibility for the safe operation of their plants and for regulatory compliance. Additional information regarding the management and organization of PECO has been provided in Reference (3).

In summary, the AmerGen and AmerGen Vermont management and organizations that will be implemented upon consummation of the merger, with Messrs. Kingsley and Skolds assuming roles in the existing organization as described above, will continue to operate their respective units in accordance with the terms of the existing licenses. Final decision making authority and licensee responsibility under these licenses will not change.
