Dear Sir:

I'm writing to let you know my feelings regarding the proposed storage of nuclear waste on the Goshiute Indian Reservation in western Utah.

I categorically oppose it for the following reasons:

We Utahns have much more than enough toxic material residing in that area with the nerve gas incinerator and the other toxic matter residing out there. Not to mention the various military experiments and tests out there with who knows what potential to wipe out all of us on the Wasatch Front, the whole state of Utah, and any other parts of the country downwind of the whole hazardous mess.

Since Mother Nature doesn't answer to government control, who knows where any mistakes will end up. There are earthquake fault lines to consider. **Utah is well strewn with fault lines, and we've been warned the big earthquake here is just a matter of when, not if.** There's also the matter of hazardous waste polluting land and ground water.
