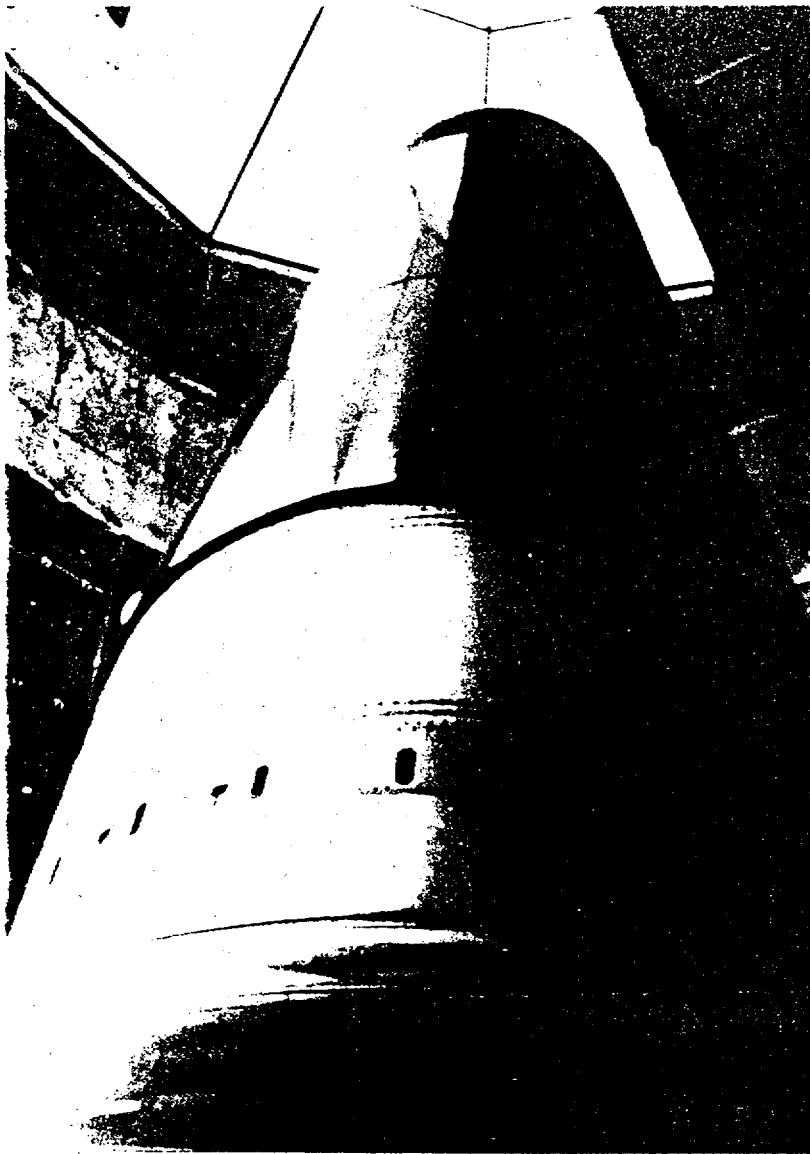

### Holy Week Peace Walk 1997

- We prepared for the Walk by weekend retreat together before beginning at St. James in Las Vegas.
- We studied, shared, sang, worshipped, enjoyed movement exercises and broke bread together.
- We believed Jesus' parade into Jerusalem was a non-violent demonstration.
- We walked into the crucifixion from Palm Sunday until Good Friday.
- We hiked and camped 65 miles from Las Vegas Department of Energy headquarters to Nevada Nuclear Testing Site.
- We believed that exploding subcritical nuclear tests underground is the global crucifixion of Jesus.
- We prayed for the powerful at the Federal Building that they would lead conversion from a military to a peaceful economy.

- We slept Palm Sunday evening on the asphalt parking lot where weapons workers park their vehicles before bus-sing for over an hour to Mercury (the town in the Test Site).
- We prayed for these workers at a sunrise service and our own complicity as citizens of a country that spends 24.6 million per day to maintain nuclear destructiveness.
- We vigiled as we walked carrying anti-nuke signs, palms and a wooden cross.
- We built a mobile community sharing everything like the early church.
- We served each other following Jesus' example especially modeled by Pierre and Brother David.
- We comforted each other when thirst, sore feet, back aches, and dust caused anxiety.
- We acted crazy rather than crabby along with Mary and Pierre.
- We welcomed the stranger.
- We included homeless, hungry, thirsty, blistered John who we found on the roadside.

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quartered in London, is active in many countries, including Israel. The campaign has the backing of many leaders from science, the arts, religion, and public affairs, and of people from all walks of life concerned about the spread of nuclear weapons.

A campaign to free Vanunu sprang up in the United States after his arrest and conviction, but it has waned in the years following his disappearance behind the walls of Ashkelon Prison. In 1992 the campaign was revived by U.S. peace activists who made contact with Vanunu's Israeli support committee and decided to lend a hand. They felt that Vanunu's cruel punishment for nuclear truth-telling presented an opportunity for Americans both to assist in a humanitarian cause and to challenge their own government's double standard on nuclear weapons proliferation. (For more than thirty years U.S. presidents have known of Israel's clandestine program and turned a blind eye to it.)

The revived U.S. Campaign to Free Mordechai Vanunu got underway in the fall of 1992 with a U.S. speaking tour by Yael Lotan, a London-based Israeli peace activist. The tour drew widespread interest and support. In consultation with the prisoner's brother, Meir Vanunu, and other leaders of the international campaign, the U.S. organizers decided to escalate their effort through a series of speaking tours culminating in a national conference in the fall of 1993. Our goal is to bring the concern of the American people to bear on those who continue to imprison this man of principle—and on the issue that led him to risk his freedom.

# Compensation due for uranium miners

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Clinton administration will ask Congress for \$50 million and change in authority to compensate hundreds of uranium miners exposed to cancer-causing radiation in the government's nuclear weapons program.

The request to broaden the current compensation program for uranium miners was part of a series of responses the White House announced March 28 to a report issued more than a year ago by a presidential commission that investigated human radiation experiments during the Cold War years.

The Energy Department, which manages the nuclear weapons program, said the miners' exposure was "inadvertently created by the government's failure to use available technology to adequately ventilate the mine shafts and reduce the risks of exposure to lung cancer."

The miners, who worked in Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, Utah and Wyoming between 1947 and 1991, and many of them are believed to be "legitimately acknowledged" compensation would go to their families if Congress agrees. A 1990 law already provides compensation to some miners, but the administration wants the criteria eased to cover about 600 additional miners.

The White House also said it had rejected a cash settlement with four additional families of uranium miners who, unknown to them, had been injected with plutonium in the 1940s as part of secret research.

The department previously had announced a settlement with 12 of the families and the family of another person injected with uranium, the cost of this settlement for

the 17 families was put at \$6.5 million.

The cases of two additional victims from the plutonium experiments are still outstanding. "One person has yet to be found and another of the families has told the government it wanted no compensation," officials said. "The victims have not been identified."

The announcement brought criticism from a group representing some survivors and families of victims of human radiation exposures.

The Task Force on Radiation and Human Rights, a coalition of families who are seeking compensation for what they maintain were past radiation exposures, accused the Energy Department of not doing enough to identify research subjects.

The administration continues to hide behind passive outreach and notification programs under the pretense that few if any were harmed by the experiments," said B. Cooper Brown, a spokesman for the group. "No one should be fooled for a moment."

He maintained that there were thousands of victims whose families deserve to be notified and compensated. The presidential advisory group acknowledged thousands of experiments but said that except for a few cases, "it could not find evidence of medical harm, nor reason for compensation." Among the exceptions were the plutonium cases.

That prompted Hazel O'Leary, the former energy secretary, to order a detailed investigation into human radiation experiments. It also led to the president's appointment of the Advisory Committee on Human Radiation Experiments, which issued its re-

port on October 1995.

The committee urged that the plutonium victims be compensated along with 52 other individuals who were subjects of various unethical experiments in the 1940s and 1950s. Little is known about the 52 research subjects and officials said Friday their identities remained unknown.

Energy Secretary Federico Pena, who succeeded O'Leary, said an interagency task force has found no evidence of any secret human research projects underway at this time. But he said neither the advisory panel nor the administration would rule out such projects in the future as long as they are conducted "ethically."

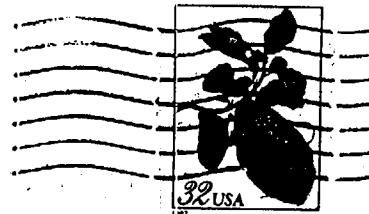
