SUBJECT: SECY-94-238 - SECTION 208 REPORT TO CONGRESS
ON ABNORMAL OCCURRENCES FOR APRIL-JUNE 1994

This is to advise you that the Commission has not objected to issuance of the Second Quarter 1994 Abnormal Occurrence (AO) Report to Congress with the changes or clarifications noted below.

1. Abnormal Occurrence Report AS 94-2 should be clarified to indicate whether the misadministration contributed to the cause of death.
2. The staff should seek additional information on Abnormal Occurrence Report AS 94-3 on the results of California's investigation before closing out this AO report, specifically,

the cause for the supplier's mistake,

whether other instances of mistaken shipments were found,

what violations were found, and

whether the supplier's procedures are adequate to prevent a recurrence or, if not, what changes were made.

The report should also include an estimation of the extremity dose received by the radiographer. If the extremity dose criterion was exceeded, this should be cited as the reason for inclusion of this case in the report to Congress.
