Dear Mr. Neal:

We appreciate the opportunity to comment on your idea for enhancing government-wide efficiency in investigating discrimination complaints. Currently, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) utilizes contractors to conduct investigations of discrimination. And, although the number of complaints filed within the NRC is relatively low (averaging approximately 12 per year), complaints involving multiple issues can be very expensive.

We are interested in discussing further your idea, and the possibility of participating in this approach at the NRC. Some of the issues we would like to discuss with you are: Agents' availability to finalize investigations they begin, even after a temporary disability ends, any required travel arrangements for the agents, quality control for the investigations and timeliness of the investigations. Please retain the NRC on your list for future correspondence regarding this idea.
