The Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1990, as amended, requires the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) in each of the fiscal years 1991 through 2000 to collect fees and annual charges that approximate 100 percent of its budget authority, less the amount appropriated to the NRC from the Nuclear Waste Fund. Consistent with past practice, we are providing you the status of fee collection activities for fiscal year 2000. Public Law 106-60 appropriated \$470,000,000 to the NRC for fiscal year 2000 of which \$19,150,000 was derived from the Nuclear Waste Fund and is excluded from license fee revenues and \$3,850,000 was appropriated for regulatory reviews and other assistance provided to the Department of Energy and other Federal agencies which also is excluded from license fee revenues.

In fiscal year 2000, NRC collected fees and other charges that offset \$447,000,000 (100 percent) of the amount required to be collected. Because of the uncertainties with the timing of collections, an additional \$3 million was collected and will be used to reduce the total fees assessed in fiscal year 2001.
