## SYNOPSIS

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region II, Office of Investigations, initiated this investigation on July 3, 2000, following a complaint by an employee at the Tennessee Valley Authority's Sequoyah Nuclear Plant that a Burns Security Service officer at the plant was observed sleeping while on duty June 5 and 7, 2000.

The evidence gathered during this investigation did not substantiate the allegation that the Burns Security Service officer was sleeping while on duty at the Sequoyah Nuclear Plant.
