HADDAM NECK DECOMMISSIONING STATUS

ACTIVITIES COMPLETED LAST MONTH

Completed inspection 00-02 and conducted an on-site inspection by M. Miller and J. Jang the week of September 11. Areas of focus for the inspection were exposure controls on the reactor vessel segmentation project, the radiological effluent program, and the High Radiation Area posting and control program.

The reactor segmentation project continued to be the job expending the most site exposure. A total of approximately 98 person-rem has been expended through September 30. However, the licensee has again reevaluated the remaining work required to complete the job and has revised upward its exposure estimate for the job to 149 person-rem. The site exposure for the year 2000 is 230 person-rem to date.

R. Bellamy supported two site public meetings in September. On September 18 the selectman of Haddam convened a special town meeting to discuss the status of the storage of spent fuel at Haddam Neck. Approximately 350 members of the public attended this 4-hour meeting. On September 19 CDAC held their scheduled monthly meeting to discuss the latest progress on Haddam Neck decommissioning. NRC Region I answered questions when required. Approximately 30 people were in attendance.

SHORT-TERM EXPECTED ACTIVITIES (WITHIN THE NEXT MONTH)

Begin inspection 00-03 with review of major decommissioning work.

LONG-TERM EXPECTED ACTIVITIES

Monitor on-site and off-site characterization and remediation activities. Review bounding dose assessment and issue special inspection report for offsite sampling results.

Monitor development of alternate plans for the disposal of Lower Steam Generator Assemblies, Reactor Coolant Pumps, Pressurizer, and Reactor Vessel. The licensee may be unable to ship these components up the Savannah River this year due to continued low water levels.

MAINE YANKEE DECOMMISSIONING STATUS

<u>ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE LAST MONTH</u>

Maine Yankee initiated construction of an independent spent fuel storage installation (ISFSI) in the north contractor parking lot. Activities included excavation and preparation of soils for pouring concrete pads, construction of an earthen berm surrounding the ISFSI, and preparations for pouring vertical concrete casks.

Maine Yankee and their contractor Framatome continued final preparations for segmenting the internals of the reactor vessel. Delays occurred with equipment installation and testing and Maine Yankee suspended work after several errors occurred during movement of the upper guide structure, including making contact with the side of the refueling cavity wall and raising the top of the upper guide structure one-foot above the water surface.

On September 30, 2000, Maine Yankee identified that at least 4 workers were exposed to radioactive contamination after they were assigned to perform work in a waste shipping container that had been improperly released from the radiologically controlled area of the site. Maine Yankee suspended all radiological work to identify root causes and proper corrective and preventative actions.

During the week of September 25, 2000, J. Carrasco (NRC Region I - DRS) performed an inspection of ISFSI construction activities, and Ron Uleck (NRC-NMSS) and a team from Sandia Laboratory inspected the site in preparation for development of an Environmental Assessment.

In consultation with multiple stake holders, including the State of Maine, Maine Yankee abandoned the concept of rubblization and now plans to ship concrete located three feet below grade and above, to out-of-state waste facilities.

SHORT-TERM ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE NEXT MONTH

Maine Yankee expects to complete their review of identified deficiencies in their radiological survey program and implement corrective actions to allow work to resume.

Work should start on reactor vessel internals segmentation.

Concrete pads at the ISFSI will be poured and the Vertical Concrete Casks should begin to be manufactured.

A CAP is scheduled for October 19, 2000. R. Ragland and R. Bellamy are scheduled to attend.

An NRC Region I inspection is scheduled for the week of October 16, 2000.

LONG TERM EXPECTED ACTIVITIES

Maine Yankee hopes to have the ISFSI concrete pad ready for receipt of GTCC canisters from reactor vessel segmentation in December 2000.

Plans and preparations continue for removal and shipping the reactor vessel to Barnwell, SC in June/July 2001.

YANKEE ROWE DECOMMISSIONING STATUS

ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE LAST MONTH

Licensee activities for the month included:

- Remediation of South Decon Room completed.
- ISFSI excavation work completed and clean fill being applied
 Construction work on the road from the Spent Fuel Pit to the ISFSI continued
 Demolition of the Modular Building began

SHORT-TERM EXPECTED ACTIVITIES (WITHIN THE NEXT MONTH)

ISFSI construction and construction work on the road from the Spent Fuel Pit to the ISFSI will be continued in October. Concrete will begin to be poured for the ISFSI. The Modular Building demolition will continue.

M. Miller to conduct inspection during the week of October 16.

LONG-TERM EXPECTED ACTIVITIES

Licensee's focus for the next year to two years is on shifting spent fuel storage to dry cask storage. During this period, remediation activities will be put on hold. Emptying the spent fuel pool will allow the remainder of the facility to be decommissioned. The planned work for the next six months includes fuel inspections, ISFSI pad construction, and Cask fabrication.

MILLSTONE UNIT ONE DECOMMISSIONING STATUS

ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE LAST MONTH

Work activities were reduced to only those necessary to reach the "cold and dark" condition. Achieving cold and dark at Unit 1 by April 1, 2001 is a condition of the sale of the Millstone site to Dominion, and is therefore a priority for the licensee.

Component installation for the new SFP cooling system installation continued, with completion estimated by December 2000.

The 4160V plant equipment separation project (GDC 17, Station Blackout, and Appendix R support for Unit 2) continued, with construction ongoing for the month. This project is the top priority at Unit 1. Insulation removal is 83% complete.

No inspections were conducted during the month. The Unit 1 inspection report period number 50-245/2000-010 ended on Sept. 21, based upon additional information supplied by the licensee during telephone conferences. Weekly telephone conferences with the licensee were established during the month.

A combined NEAC/Haddam Neck and MIDAC meeting was held on September 28, 2000. No NRC representatives attended.

SHORT-TERM EXPECTED ACTIVITIES (WITHIN THE NEXT MONTH)

The construction (mechanical systems/structures) of the spent fuel pool island (SFPI) cooling system will continue with more piping installation and electrical work.

A meeting of the MIDAC is scheduled for Thursday, October 5, 2000. Todd Jackson will attend the MIDAC meeting to represent Region I and provide a quarterly update of NRC activities, and will also be on site for inspection October 2-6, 2000.


