I. SECY-92-077 - Motion to Dismiss Petitions for Intervention in
Shoreham Decommissioning Proceeding

The Commission, by a 5-0 vote, approved an order responding to a motion by the NRC staff to dismiss two petitions for intervention and requests for hearings filed by the Shoreham-Wading River Central School District and the Scientists and Engineers for Secure Energy. The order denied the motion to dismiss. The petition will be forwarded to the Licensing Board for processing in accordance with the NRC's Rules of Practice.

II. SECY-92-076 - Final Rule Entitled "Uranium Enrichment
Regulations"

The Commission, by a 5-0 vote, approved a final rule which amends its regulations concerning the licensing of uranium enrichment facilities to reflect changes made to the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 by the Solar, Wind, Waste and Geothermal Power Production Incentives Act of 1990. The amendments provide for the licensing of uranium enrichment facilities under provisions of the AEA pertaining to source material and special nuclear material rather than under the provisions pertaining to a production facility.

The attached edits should be incorporated into the Federal Register Notice, the rule should be forwarded to the Regulatory Publications Branch, ADM, for review, and forwarded to SECY for signature and publication.

III. SECY-92-107 - Limited Changes to 10 CFR Parts 170 and 171 License and Annual Fees

The Commission, by a 5-0 vote, approved amendments to 10 CFR Parts 170 and 171 which revise the fee billing intervals and the annual fees assessed to small entities in 10 CFR Part 171.

The Federal Register Notice should be reviewed by the Regulatory Publications Branch, ADM, and forwarded to SECY for signature and publication.

IV. SECY-92-098 - Appeal from Seabrook Order LBP-91-24 Disposing of Last Outstanding Emergency Planning Issue

The Commission, by a 2-0 vote, approved an order which disposes of appeals by the Massachusetts Attorney General and the New England Coalition on Nuclear Pollution from LBP-91-24, a Licensing Board final ruling on the adequacy of emergency planning for the Seabrook Station by affirming the Licensing Board's Order.

Chairman Selin and Commissioner Rogers approved the order; Commissioner de Planque abstained; and Commissioners Curtiss and Remick did not participate in the matter.
