SUBJECT: EXEMPTION FROM LOCAL LEAK RATE TESTING (LLRT) SCHEDULE REQUIREMENTS

By letter dated October 22, 1985 you requested a schedular exemption to 10 CFR 50, Appendix J, Section JJJ.D.3 for 71 valves which must be Type C tested. This testing would require you to go to cold shutdown and you are requesting up to a six month delay because of your recent start up. Our review of your exemption is in progress and will be completed in a timely manner.

As noted in your exemption request, these tests are not only required by Appendix J but also by your Technical Specifications to be performed at intervals no greater than two years. Your Technical Specifications section 4.4.1.2.5 requires these tests to be performed at a frequency of at least each refueling period. Your Technical Specification section 1.2.8 defines a Refueling interval as "the time between normal refuelings of the reactor not to exceed 24 months without prior approval of the NRC." You then further stated that this wording in your Technical Specifications allows approval of your exemption request without a license amendment.

After reviewing your technical specifications and the exemption request, we conclude that a change to your technical specifications is necessary in addition to your exemption request. We believe that in this particular instance, the method of "prior approval of the NRC" should be by a Technical Specification change.

J understand the time constraints involved as the time interval ends February 23, 1986. We are processing the exemption request, but you will need to expeditiously apply for an appropriate Technical Specification change to compliment your exemption request.
