Advance Notice of Request for Waiver**

The purpose of this letter is to provide advance notice of a request of a waiver of the experience requirements defined in NUREG-1021 paragraph D.2.a.(1), so that SRO candidate, (Docket Number 55-22025) may take the SRO license examination scheduled for Beaver Valley Unit No. 2 during the week of March 26, 2001.

NUREG-1021 examination standard (ES) 202 paragraph D.2.a.(1), Senior Reactor Operator experience, indicates that the applicant should have at least six months of nuclear power plant experience at the plant for which the applicant seeks a license. The SRO candidate does not meet this requirement since he left his licensed operator position at another facility and immediately enrolled in the Beaver Valley Power Station Licensed Operator Initial Training Program.


This matter was discussed between Mr. Richard Conte, Chief, Operator Licensing and Human Performance Branch and Mr. Patrick Schwartz, Superintendent, Operations Training. A copy of the candidate's resume was requested during the discussion and is attached. The NRC Form 398 that will be submitted with the candidate's application will request a waiver with respect to the six month experience requirement. Upon successful completion of the license examination and until the candidate's operator license is issued, the candidate will participate in the Beaver Valley Power Station's accredited Licensed Operator Retraining program. It is understood that an operator license will not be issued by the NRC until documentation is provided for completion of the 6 months experience requirement at Beaver Valley Power Station.
