Dear NRC,

After reviewing the information in "Human Interaction with Reused Soil: A Literature Search", a supposed technical research on options of soil reuse, I am concerned that the real intent is to provide a way for the government, nuclear factories, and other NRC facilities to sell radioactive soil to home owners, builders, contractors, playgrounds, and any other suburban, urban, and agricultural development site. Time and time again citizens have told policymakers that they do not want to assume the risk posed by releasing radioactive materials, no matter how little radioactive contamination there may be. I strongly believes that any radioactively contaminated soil should be kept out of citizen's back yards and off children's playgrounds.

These scenarios were developed under an interagency agreement between the NRC and the National Agricultural Library, a subdivision of the Agricultural Research Service run by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Why don't you be a bit more forthcoming with your real intent so the American public has the opportunity to see clearly on this issue. I am strongly apposed to this type of research.
