RSO Training

Dear Mr. Ting:

As discussed with Mr. Ken Hooks of your office, the bi-annual ROS training as described in Reg Guide 8.31, 2.4.1.3, was due for the Grants site ROS representative late this fall. According to the consultant that handles the training, the fall class was cancelled due to lack of participants. The course will now be offered only once a year rather than twice per year as in previous years. The next class will be in the Spring of 2001.

The ROS duties at Grants have been scaled back dramatically over the past 9 years and especially over the past 5 since the tailings have been contained and covered. The radiological work is now reduced to one part time technician and the RSO. The technician's tasks include general record keeping, quarterly TLD badges, quarterly perimeter air sampling, semi-annual regional radon cup sampling, and quarterly POC water sampling, and the occasional radiation work order related to drilling collection wells in the large tailings pile.

I have been the RSO for the Grants site since 1995. I have 10 years of experience, 5 years at an active uranium mill from 1975 thru 1980 and 5 years at this inactive site.



The new training schedule for Grants RSO will start in the spring of 2001 and continue bi-annually.
