I have just today seen the information that NRC (Nuclear Regulatory Commission), official public protector from radioactive contaminations, is considering the sale of (probably "slightly" or "decontaminated") contaminated soil for "realistic reuse scenarios" such as (!), golf courses, home landscaping, athletic fields, playgrounds, farms, paving mix, adobe brick, ash, among others.
