SUBJECT: TURKEY POINT LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION - DOCKET NOS. 50-250 AND 50-251

Dear Ms. Lorion:

I am responding to your letters to the Region II Administrator in our Atlanta office dated October 13, and October 23, 2000. We regret the difficulty you experienced in contacting the Region II office.

You requested that (1) a "hard" copy of the Turkey Point License Renewal Application and a copy of the original environmental impact statement be placed in a local public document room or library, (2) the date by which hearing requests and intervention petitions must be filed, which is November 13, 2000, be extended to 30 days after the requested documentation is placed in a local facility, and (3) you be added to the distribution list for documents regarding the license renewal application for the Turkey Point Plant.

As you are aware, the License Renewal application is available in hard copy in the NRC's Public Document room at NRC headquarters in accordance with NRC requirements in addition to being available on the NRC website at the Web address for the Electronic Reading Room <<u>http://www.nrc.gov/NRC/ADAMS/index.html></u>. The availability of the application was described in the Federal Register Notice of acceptance for docketing and an opportunity for hearing, published on October 12, 2000 (65 FR 60693). In addition, in response to your request, a complete copy of the license renewal application, the original environmental impact statement, and some other pertinent documents have been made available in hard copy for public review at the Homestead Branch Library located at 700 N Homestead Blvd., Homestead, Florida 33030.

With respect to your request for an extension of the November 13, 2000, deadline for hearing requests and intervention petitions as set forth in the October 12, 2000, <u>Federal Register</u> Notice referenced above, we are referring your request to the Secretary of the Commission. Unless the Commission determines otherwise, November 13, 2000, remains the date by which hearing requests and intervention petitions must be filed.

Finally, we will be glad to include your name on the service list for the correspondence related to this license renewal application.
