I am requesting a copy of NUREG-1725. Please send information on how I can
obtain a copy.

When visiting <http://www.nrc.gov/NRC/NUREGS/SR1725/index.html> to read the
NUREG-1725 release, I was consistently unable to print pages 64 through 76
of the PDF document. These are pages that list reviewer concerns over
effects of contaminated soil entering the population through the food chain.
In particular the communications from Carla Long Casler and NRC comments
discounting the validity of her questions regarding Chernobyl and Three Mile
Island effects on human populations.

Other PDF documents in the NUREGS listing that I sampled did not display the
same problem of inability to print pages. Other PDF documents in the NUREGS
listing are available for download. Is this an oversight on your part? I
am interested in disseminating this document to other interested parties
without internet access.

I am shocked that the NRC would seek to reduce its expenditures in the
correct decommissioning of nuclear waste in this manner. Has the
Environmental Protection Agency been notified of your intent to create
nuclear waste brown fields?

Would you elect to live in a home that was backfilled with low level
radioactive waste?
Would you allow your children to eat food grown in "Reused Soil"
