In accordance with the requirements of our Byproduct Material Licenses No. 12-140-4 (G65) Amendments No. 7 and 9, and No. 12-140-6 (D66) we are hereby reporting material transfers in accordance with Section 30.24(h)(2) 10 CFR 30. The reporting period as required runs from July 1, 1963 to June 30, 1964. Our radioisotope uses in Agreement states are not included in this letter.

1. License 12-140-4 (G65) Amendment No. 7. Gasoline containing hydrogen-3 at a concentration not to exceed 8 x 10-5 microcuries per milliliter in accordance with section 19 of this license.
