HOUSE, SENATE ANNOUNCE TENTATIVE RECESS SCHEDULES

Dec. 20, 2000 - While nothing is final yet, congressional leaders have penciled in a tentative recess schedule for the next year. The schedule calls for lawmakers to assemble Jan. 3 and remain in town through the Saturday, Jan. 6 joint session to count Electoral College ballots. Inauguration Day, of course, is Jan. 20.

Jan. 6: 1 p.m., joint session to count electoral ballots.

Jan. 20: Presidential Inauguration.

Feb. 17-25: President's Day recess.

April 7-22: Easter recess.

May 26-June 3: Memorial Day recess.

June 30-July 8: Independence Day recess.

Aug. 4- Sept. 3: August recess.
