SUBJECT: STAFF REQUIREMENTS - DISCUSSION/POSSIBLE VOTE ON FULL POWER OPERATING LICENSE FOR COMANCHE PEAK (UNIT 1), 2:00 P.M., MONDAY, APRIL 16, 1990, COMMISSIONERS' CONFERENCE ROOM, ONE WHITE FLINT NORTH, ROCKVILLE, MARYLAND (OPEN TO PUBLIC ATTENDANCE)

The Commission was briefed by the TU Electric Company (applicant), the Citizens Association for Sound Energy (CASE), and the staff on the applicant's readiness to receive a full power operating license for the Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station, Unit 1.

A presentation was also made by the Citizens Association for Sound Energy (CASE), represented by Billie Pirner Garde.

The Commission, with all Commissioners agreeing, authorized the staff to issue, upon findings that the applicant has satisfied all requirements, a full power operating license to TU Electric Company for the Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station, Unit 1.

In addition, the Commission requested copies of the allegation package received on April 9, 1990 and the staff's written statement of position on the allegations contained in that package. The Commission requested that it be informed of the results of the April 17, 1990, meeting to evaluate the licensee response to the recent flux doubling events at the Comanche Peak Steam Electric Station.

Commissioner Curtiss encouraged the staff to closely monitor licensee performance in implementing commitments for root cause analysis.
